Act for "laying down science based standards for ...food and to regulate their manufacture, storage, distribution, sale and import, to ensure availability of safe and wholesome food for human consumption and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto"

> as against that of PFA "Act to prevent Adulteration in Food"



Understand and Share

Acts says

"establish a system of network of organisations with the aim to facilitate a scientific co-operation framework by the co-ordination of activities, the exchange of information, the development and implementation of joint projects, the exchange of expertise and best practices in the fields within the Food Authority's responsibility"

Mantra 5

Be open to learning from International Best Practices & Adapt

Act Says:

"promote consistency between international technical standards and domestic food standards while ensuring that the level of protection adopted in the country is not reduced"



Take decisions based on risk assessment



Focus completely on Hygiene and Safety
